Cookie Walk 2021

Cookie Walk 2021 Update and Calendar

We are coming down to the wire with the cookie walk. Twenty people have told me they are willing to help in various ways, including baking, packing cookie boxes, setting up, decorating, manning tables and cleaning up. But, all are welcome to come and help. The Cookie Walk will be held December 11 & 12, Saturday and Sunday. What follows is our calendar:

First week in November: tickets will be available November 7. Tickets are numbered so we can track who takes them and when funds are turned in. We will be selling 500 tickets at \$10 / ticket. This means we need at least 500 dozen cookies or . . . since we pack a "baker's dozen", 6,500 cookies. (Believe me, we have done this and more!) Take as many tickets as you think you can sell, or buy them for friends and family. We will be advertising the Cookie Walk on our sign.

Bakers may start making and freezing cookie dough if desired. But, please, since we are pre-packing, do not make "wet" cookies (example: Lime bars with the crust base and jelly lime topping) since they will affect the crispness of other decorated sugar cookies in the pre-pack box. Cookies should all be at least 2".

December 1 – 10: Bake, bake, bake, bake !!!!

December 9 (Thursday) 12 noon - late: Set up the 5 tables and decorate the table "booths". Each table area may be decorated differently. We have some decorations but may need more, so think about what you may bring to help decorate. One table will be reserved for St. Daniel's Apostolic Church, who will sell their own baked goods and collect their own funds. Cookies can be delivered. Need set up folks, decorators, cookie box packers, ribbon tie-ers, sticker placers, table set up-ers.

December 10 (Friday) 9:00a - late: Finish decorating, take cookie deliveries, and begin packing cookies into the 4 types of boxes: Gluten-free, sugar-free, and 2 types of regular cookies. We will also continue to pack boxes on cookie sale days. Need same folks as Thursday.

December 11 (Saturday) 9:00a – 5:00p: Sale Day !: Need at least 4 table sales managers, who will collect the cookie tickets in exchange for cookie boxes. Preference is for 2/table. We decided to have clear boxes so purchasers may view the cookies through the box. We will also need cookie box packers and runners.

December 12 (Sunday) 12:00 – finish: Last sale day. Again need table managers, cookie boxers, and runners. We will need folks to take down the tables and organize the decorations for storage or take home.

December 13 (Monday) 9:00am: Finish take down and clean up, if necessary.

A Summary of the Search Process

1. The Vestry will serve as the search committee
2. The Vestry will collect photos, stories, demographic, financial and other data
3. Through consultation with the parish and in coordination with Canon Anna, a parish profile will be developed for clergy candidates to consider
4. Our parish profile will be widely circulated and advertised through various networks
5. Clergy candidates will submit their Office of Transition Ministry (OTM) Profile and resumes to the Office of the Bishop where an initial "red flag" check and Zoom interview will be conducted. "Red Flag" checks include: disciplinary action, situation of the candidate's current call, and any other information that might disqualify them as a viable candidate.
6. Viable candidate OTM Profiles & resumes will be forwarded to the Vestry for review and selection of candidates for initial Zoom interview
7. Following the initial interviews, a short list will be established and follow-up interviews (either in-person or via Zoom) will be scheduled
8. After the follow-up interview, the Vestry will discuss the short list of candidates and pray about who they would like to extend a call to
9. The final reference and background checks will be completed as well as a Bishop-to-Bishop call
10. An offer to call the candidate will be extended and announcements made!


